The tonic note and chord will be played each time.







- 2) Write a harmony line underneath using **either** the treble or bass clef. You do not necessarily need more than one bass note per bar.






Extract Geehl: Watching the Wheat (arrangement)

- (h) The beginning and end of the tune remains with the Euphonium and the harmony is mostly unchanged


